LCT creates imaginative, compelling theatre experiences for young people and families.



We share a collective aspiration to impart, explore, foster, and develop artistry at all levels and ages in every theatrical discipline and educational opportunity.



LCT is committed to providing a diverse season that allows every young person to see themselves on our stage, helping us work toward creating an equitable and antiracist environment for young people and their families.



We ignite creativity by designing and building the worlds of a nine-show season. We create:

- **Tour Shows**

Traveling throughout Kentucky, performing in schools, libraries, and community centers (occasionally traveling out of state to theatre venues), tour shows are cast with professional actors.

- **Community Shows**

These productions are designed to provide young people with professional live theatre experience across all artistic and technical areas. Community productions feature local actors age nine and up.

- **Theatre for the Very Young**

Designed for ages 2-5, these interactive productions are devised in collaboration with the show's cast.



Located in the heart of Lexington, Kentucky, our facility houses

- **Two Theatres: The Larry and Vivian Snipes Main Stage** - a 300-seat 3/4 thrust designed specifically for young audiences **The Learning Stage** - a 125-seat theatre designed for hands-on educational programming

- **Two Studios** For rehearsals and classes

- **Scenery and Costume Shops**

- **Administrative Offices**

LCT is proud to participate in Bluegrass Greensource's Green Check program. Through their program, our efforts will help us lay a foundation for our ongoing commitment to reducing our environmental impact and creating a better future for the young people we serve.



We implement a four-quarter, on-site and off-site Theatre School for ages 4-16, two acting companies for middle and high schoolers, Theatre Education initiatives, and statewide outreach education programming.

SUMMER TEACHING ARTISTS (10 positions)

Lexington Children's Theatre is looking for Summer Teaching Artists to teach and direct in our Summer Theatre School program for students 4-18.

Teaching Artists will coordinate and implement lesson plans and art activities, and immerse themselves in developing young people's creativity and imagination. We ask that Teaching Artists have a love of young people, an interest in Theatre for Young Audiences, and be excited about teaching. The Teaching Artists will report to the Education Director and receive training to share the arts with the young people in Kentucky.

What We Offer

This position offers \$15 an hour with a 40-hour workweek. LCT Housing is available to employees for \$75 per week. Our Townhouses offer laundry, internet, and paid utilities. There is a guaranteed day off each week with 3 sick days. Memorial Day, Juneteenth, and July 4th holidays are paid holidays.

RESIDENT TEACHING ARTIST

Reporting to the Education Director, the Resident Teaching Artist contributes to and participates in the successful completion of all aspects of LCT's professional season and education programming.

The Resident Teaching Artists (RTAs) develop and facilitate high-quality educational programs and experiences for young people and our community. The RTA teaches in LCT's offsite and outreach classes and writes lesson plans, arts-integration residencies, and resource materials for teachers. Additionally, the RTA performs administrative duties, including correspondence with patrons, class registrations, and enrollment management. The RTA may assist with LCT's production as needed.

PRODUCTION ASSOCIATE
